 - Expand member engagement, recruitment, retention, and programming efforts.
 - Continue wise financial management to garner the biggest benefit for NYSAFP.
 - Continue Leadership Development and Succession Planning
 - Increase Visibility & Clout of NYSAFP (Advocacy)
 - Develop and expand a 3-year pragmatic focus on Diversity & Inclusiveness; Research DEI initiatives.
 - **2022–23: Serving Our Members & Developing the Next Generations of Leaders**
 - Clearing the pandemic, bring new focus on re-connecting members beyond the virtual.
 - Review and re-tool all Academy outreach efforts into a true Statewide Delivery Plan, building on member engagement, recruitment and retention.

- Vito and I did the Introduction to the NYSAFP presentation via WebEx for the residency program in Syracuse. I encourage all of us to commit to doing the presentation to our local FMIG and/or residency program, live or over Zoom
- With the help and guidance of Marcy and Vito, I have communicated with the governor’s office and other community officials on a broad range of topics including:
 - Onondaga Commissioner of Health asking him to acknowledge the role of family physicians in providing mental health care for underserved populations
 - Applauding Action Taken by NYS Office of Cannabis Management to Regulate Packaging, Labelling and Marketing of Adult Use Cannabis Products
 - Letter to assembly/senate members requesting opposition to copay accumulator programs
 - Letters to governor in support of:
 - Defining credentials of clinical peer reviewers
 - Providing lactation facilities at airports
 - Formation of a primary care reform commission
 - Veto an act to amend the estates, powers and trusts law, in relation to payment and distribution of damages in wrongful death actions
 - Veto bill which mandates providing patients written information about specific conditions
 - Veto bill to allow PA’s to be listed as PCP
 - Letter to Montefiore administration, copied to legislators, opposing the closure of the FHC

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
